MODULE TITLE: CONSERVATION CHALLENGE	
MODULE DESCRIPTION: Students explore a particular habitat/s to identify and understand why it is important to protect, conserve and/or manage habitats for nature conservation. Students will actively participate in a practical management exercise with the aim to increase their pride and appreciation of natural places.	
ECO CHALLENGE OUTCOME: To increase knowledge and understanding of the natural environment; To increase pride in their local green spaces.
